Workshop – Writing in Tibetan

Tibetan is one of the smaller languages, but basicly, it is a whole language family with approx. 60 sub-languages, called "dialects". Standard language is the "Lhasa Dialect", the written Tibetan has remained almost unchanged for the past centuries and Buddhists consider it to be a holy language the learning of which contributes to enlightenment. The written Tibetan had been developed by the Indian savant Thumbi Sambhota during the language reformation which was ordered by king Tri Song Detsen in the 7th century. Since then, it is still used throughout Tibet.

During this weekend, we learn basic consonants and – if our time permits it – also some vowels of the Tibetan alphabet. Please bring a DIN A4 exercise book (lining as for the first or second year of elementary school), a pen, e. g. by Pelikan including the necessary ink as well as enthusiasm and a good mood.
